Maharashtra National Law University, Nagpur (MNLU, Nagpur) was established in the year 2016 by the Government of Maharashtra by way of an enactment known as the Maharashtra National Law University Act (Maharashtra Act No. VI of 2014) to further the cause of academic excellence in the legal fraternity. With Hon'ble Shri Justice S.A. Bobde, Judge, Supreme Court of India as Chancellor, the University is committed to pioneering innovative research and shaping the minds of the greatest young lawyers of the coming generations. The University has employed an exceptional faculty to achieve this goal. Together, the teaching and non-teaching staff is dedicated to grooming and fostering young students as they realise their ambitions and quench their thirst for knowledge.



Dharmadhikari, Judge, High Court of Bombay, Hon'ble Shri Justice Vipin Sanghi, Judge, High Court of Delhi and Shri Mukul Rohatgi, Former Attorney General and Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India were the Guests of Honour. The lecture was instituted by the family members of Late Shri G.L. Sanghi, Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India. Prof. (Dr.) Vijender Kumar, Vice-Chancellor, delivered the welcome speech and felicitated the guests of the programme. Hon'ble Shri Justice A.K. Sikri, in his lecture, explained the importance of independence of judiciary for the functioning of an effective democracy. He emphasised the Constitutional provisions and judicial decisions which guarantees the independence and impartiality of judiciary. He appreciated the remarkable contribution made by National Law Schools in shaping the minds of budding lawyers, judges and academicians to uphold the Constitutional ideals of democracy, separation of executive and judiciary and ultimately, the rule of law. He remarked that Law Schools should focus more on inculcating the values of compassion and integrity so as to make not just good lawyers, but also credible citizens who can be role models for the evolving society.

2nd Justice S.M. Daud Memorial Lecture



The 2nd Justice S.M. Daud Memorial Lecture was held on January 12, 2019, wherein Hon'ble Smt. Justice Ruma Pal, Former Judge, Supreme Court of India delivered a lecture on the topic 'Freedom of Religion under the Constitution'. The programme was presided over by Hon'ble Shri Justice V.S. Sirpurkar, Former Judge, Supreme Court of India, Former Chairman, Competition Appellate Tribunal and Chairman, Authority for Advance Rulings. Prof. (Dr.) Vijender Kumar, Vice-Chancellor, delivered the welcome speech and felicitated the guests. Hon'ble Smt. Justice Ruma Pal highlighted how religion has always assumed a position of heightened importance in the lives of Indians, thus becoming a source of both fervent celebrations as well as violent clashes. She commented on the contribution of religious diversity to the richness of Indian culture, as well as to a large number of its social, political and legal disputes. A case in point that was discussed was the petition made to the Supreme Court of India to allow entry of women into the Sabarimala temple, which had been prohibited among the worshippers of Lord Ayyappa. She also illustrated many other cases involving similar conflicts that have reached the Courts' doorstep along the year, and the tests and approach adopted by the Judiciary to resolve such sensitive religious issues. She also threw light on the thin rope that the legislators and Judges have to walk on to strike a balance between the often-conflicting Fundamental Rights of religion on one hand, and equality and dignity on the other. Ramesh Kumar, Registrar (I/c) and OSD (Academics) of the University, presented the Vote of Thanks and appreciated the audience for attending the lecture and recognised the efforts of faculty members, research associates, students and non-teaching staff of the University in smooth organisation of the programme.

Student Committee Orientation

Intra-University Client Counselling Competition

Client counselling competitions are organised by the University to help the students in understanding the practical nuances of law. A legal student should be well-versed with the interviewing skills to advice the people who seek assistance for the hindrance caused in their lives. The intra-university client counselling competition provides a significant platform through which the budding lawyers become efficient and skilful for gathering the pertinent data from their clients. The students here learn the interaction, listening and questioning abilities whic would help them in future to gather the accurate information and to reach client satisfaction. The counsellor should develop a relationship of trust and understanding, so that the client should feel secure and comfortable when the client is delivering the data to the counsellor. The client and counsellor should reach a decision based on the factual matrix of the case, which will provide the starting key of filing a case in the Court. The competition provides an opportunity for the students to know the lawyering skills and professional ethics, which help them in building confidence and to look at the law from practical lenses.


